Weather Wizardry

Four meteorological forecasters were in attendance this morning (Stephanie, Karl, John, and Dick). I notice that they tend to congregate for support during unsettled conditions and shake their heads and frown in unison as mendicant witches peering into the meteorological miasma

("(D)ouble, double toil and trouble; Fire burn and cauldron bubble. **MacBeth**). All this suggests that our forecast should be twice as good today as yesterday when only two forecasters were present.



there will be isolated Today thundershowers developing over the Gulf and moving across the coast in a southeast to northwest direction. The winds aloft are weaker and more southerly than yesterday. While the chance of more thunderstorms remains through tomorrow morning, there should be a general drying trend through the weekend and a return to conditions more conducive to the production and accumulation of secondary air pollution. Beyond that, we'll have to wait and see where tropical storm/hurricane Debby goes.

For those of you that think hurricane intervention is an unusual occurrence, you might want to consider that on this date in 1998, the remains of Tropical Storm Charley dumped over 17 inches of rain on Del

Rio, Texas - by far the largest one day total rainfall record for the city.

Electra N308D

Today's Electra flight plans call for a urban characterization study over the Dallas-Fort Worth area. According to the forecast models, the urban plume should move northwest of the city. The Electra lifted off at approximately 11:30

this morning to tip-toe through the showers on their way north. The estimated 5 to 6 hour flight should remain in the mixed layer at levels of 2000, 3500, and 5000 feet above the ground.

The Electra will not fly tomorrow in deference to the media day event.

G-1 N701BN

The G-1 is not flying today and will not fly tomorrow in order to participate in media day.

DC-3 N56KS

The DC-3 is not flying today and will not fly tomorrow in order to participate in media day.

Twin Otter N153BU

The Twin Otter is not flying today and will not fly tomorrow in order to participate in media day.

However, we do have some interesting data plots on page three which cover a high ozone day -Monday. August 21st. The first figure, depicts the 10:00 AM flight measures fairly uniform levels of ozone (20 to 30 ppb) near the surface - below 1000 feet - over both bay and land. The second figure depicts the ozone data from the 3:00 PM flight where ozone levels have increased everywhere but particularly over downtown and the western portion of the ship channel where a maximum short-term ozone concentrations above 200 ppby were observed. The Aldine, Houston Regional Office and Crawford sites recorded hourly averages in excess of 150 ppbv in the early afternoon.

Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commissioner (TNRCC) Ralph Marquez will be joined by Houston Mayor Lee Brown, Harris County Judge Robert Eckels, EPA Region 6 Administrator Gregg Cooke and other officials Thursday to officially kickoff the Texas 2000 Air Quality Study, the most extensive study of air quality ever conducted in Texas.

The official kickoff will be at 2:00 PM on Thursday, August 24th, at Hangar 594 at Ellington Field, 12000 Aerospace Avenue in Houston. The media should come to Southwest Services, Building 493, to gain admittance to the hangar.

The study, which will cost as much as \$20 million, is a comprehensive research project designed to shed new light on the complicated issues associated with air quality in the Houston-Galveston area and throughout East Texas.

Six research aircraft are being used in the study. Several of these aircraft will be on display during the press conference.
